



## MCHENRY COUNTY ESPORTS ACADEMY POLICIES

1. Participation. MC Esports primary objective is “Everyone Plays”. However, if at any time a player violates our code of conduct or declines to participate, MC Esports reserves the right to bench and/or replace that player for the greater good of their team.
2. Refunds. MC Esports provides refunds only if a player is unable to be placed on a team due to low player numbers. Refunds will not be granted after players have been officially registered as a HSEL or MSEL team and placed on an official competitive roster.
3. Grades. Players may participate in scrim and tournament play only if they are eligible from their households via grades and/or behavior. Parents or guardians have full control of their child’s eligibility, and MC Esports will support all parents in their eligibility decisions.
4. Media and Social Media. MC Esports reserves the right to capture pictures and video of all players for the use of publication and advertising.
5. Liability. Participation in esports activities may involve risk of personal injury based on events held and locations. Participation in the MC Esports program is voluntary and requires players to follow instructions and abide by our code of conduct. With the appreciation of risks associated with the MC Esports program and activities, MC Esports, staff, volunteers, partners, or related parties will not be held responsible for any type of personal injury or loss.
6. Emergency. In the event of an emergency involving any player or players, significant efforts will be made to contact parents or guardians. In the event that parents or guardians cannot be reached, proper emergency treatment will automatically be administered.
